94th CAVALRY

Parent unit organized 15 June 1918 in the Minnesota National Guard as 2d Infantry by consolidation of the 1st, 6th and 11th Battalions of the Home Guard (organized in 1917)

Redesignated 1 August 1918 as 5th Infantry

Organized and Federally recognized 17 January 1919

Redesignated 1 December 1923 as 205th Infantry

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 1 July 1940 as 215th Coast Artillery

Inducted into Federal service 6 January 1941

Regiment broken up 1 July 1944 and 1st Battalion redesignated 598th Antiaircraft Artillery Gun Battalion (Regimental Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, disbanded; 2d Battalion redesignated 599th Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion, separate lineage)

Inactivated 29 October 1944 at Camp Maxey, Texas

Reorganized and Federally recognized 1 October 1946 as 598th Antiaircraft Artillery Gun Battalion with Headquarters at Duluth (all new batteries)

Redesignated 1 October 1949 as 598th Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion

Redesignated 16 July 1951 as 598th Antiaircraft Artillery Gun Battalion

Redesignated 1 October 1954 as 598th Antiaircraft Artillery Battalion

Reorganized, converted, and redesignated (less Battery B) 22 February 1959 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 109th Transportation Battalion, and the 114th, 224th, and 535th Transportation Companies

Consolidated, reorganized, converted, and redesignated 1 April 1963 as 94th Cavalry, a parent regiment under the Combat Arms Regimental System; to consist of the 1st Squadron, an element of the 47th Infantry Division



Lineage and Honors

94th ARMOR

Organized 1 April 1942 in the Army of the United States at Camp Forrest, Tennessee, from personnel of the 33d Infantry Division as the 1st Battalion, 136th Infantry, an element of the 33d Infantry Division

Inactivated 5 February 1946 in Japan (136th Infantry concurrently relieved from assignment to the 33d Infantry Division; assigned 10 June 1946 to the 47th Infantry Division)

Allotted 21 June 1946 to the Minnesota National Guard

Reorganized and Federally recognized 29 January 1947 with Headquarters at Hibbing

Ordered into active Federal service 16 January 1951 at home stations

(1st Battalion, 136th Infantry [NGUS], organized and Federally recognized 16 January 1953 with Headquarters at Hibbing)

Released 2 December 1954 from active Federal service and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from the 1st Battalion, 136th Infantry (NGUS)

Converted and redesignated 22 February 1959 as the 2d Reconnaissance Squadron, 194th Armor, an element of the 47th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1963 as the 2d Battalion, 194th Armor, an element of the 47th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1968 as the 194th Armor, a parent regiment under the Combat Arms Regimental System, to consist of the 2d Battalion, an element of the 47th Infantry Division

Redesignated 8 January 1972 as the 94th Armor to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 47th Infantry Division

## 94th ARMOR

Withdrawn 1 June 1989 from the Combat Arms Regimental System and reorganized under the United States Army Regimental System

Reorganized 1 September 1991 to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 34th Infantry Division
